

Quick Guide: Home Electrification Rebates



Switching your home appliances from gas to electric can improve indoor air quality, save you money through efficiency, reduce fire risk, and keep you comfortable! And, since the City of Mountain View receives carbon-free electricity from Silicon Valley Clean Energy, making the switch from gas to electricity helps our community fight climate change!

Check out the many incentives available to help you make the switch:



Heat Pump Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning Systems

- \$2,500 rebate from SVCE
- \$1,000 rebate from BayREN
- \$1,000 rebate from TECH Clean CA
- 30% cost, up to \$2,000 total, in federal tax credits

Electrical Panels and Wiring

- \$500 rebate per circuit, up to \$2,000 total, for prewiring for future electric appliances from SVCE
- \$1,000 rebate for a main panel upgrade from SVCE
- \$500 rebate for removal of the gas meter from SVCE

Space and water heating are the 2 biggest energy users in homes!



Heat Pump Water Heaters

- Save up to \$10,000 from TECH Clean CA rebates
- Up to \$2,000 rebate from SVCE
- \$1,000 rebate from BayREN
- \$900 rebate from Golden State Rebates
- 30% cost, up to \$2,000 total, in federal tax credits

Whole Home Electrification

- \$4,250 incentive from California Energy-Smart Homes program for completing whole home electrification, with a \$250 heat pump dryer bonus and a \$1,000 infrastructure upgrade bonus

Heat Pump Dryers

- \$250 rebate from BayREN

Induction Cooktops

- \$250 rebate from BayREN

Home Energy Efficiency and Electrification

Silicon Valley Clean Energy offers rebates for home electrification: SVcleanenergy.org/home-rebates. Incentives include \$2000 for a heat pump water heater, \$2,500 for a Heat Pump HVAC system, and more!

BayREN offers free home energy evaluations, energy saving kits, and rebates up to \$4,500 for electrification and energy efficiency improvements. BayREN works with other programs to bring you rebates: visit BayREN.org/homes or call [866-878-6008](tel:866-878-6008).

Electric Vehicles

Income-qualified residents can trade in a vehicle model year 2005 or older and get up to \$9,500 from the Bay Area Air Quality Management District for a new or used electric or plug-in hybrid car or a mobility option (public transit, electric bicycles). Learn more: BAAQMD.gov/CleanCarsForAll

Solar and Battery Storage

Deduct up to 30% of the cost of installing a rooftop solar energy system or solar-powered battery storage system with federal tax credits valid through 01/01/2024: EnergyStar.gov/about/federal_tax_credits

Income Qualified

The PG&E Family Electric Rate Assistance Program (FERA) provides a discount on electric bills for families with a household income that slightly exceeds CARE allowances: Pge.com/fera

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) is a federally-funded program that assists low-income households with paying home energy bills once a year.
